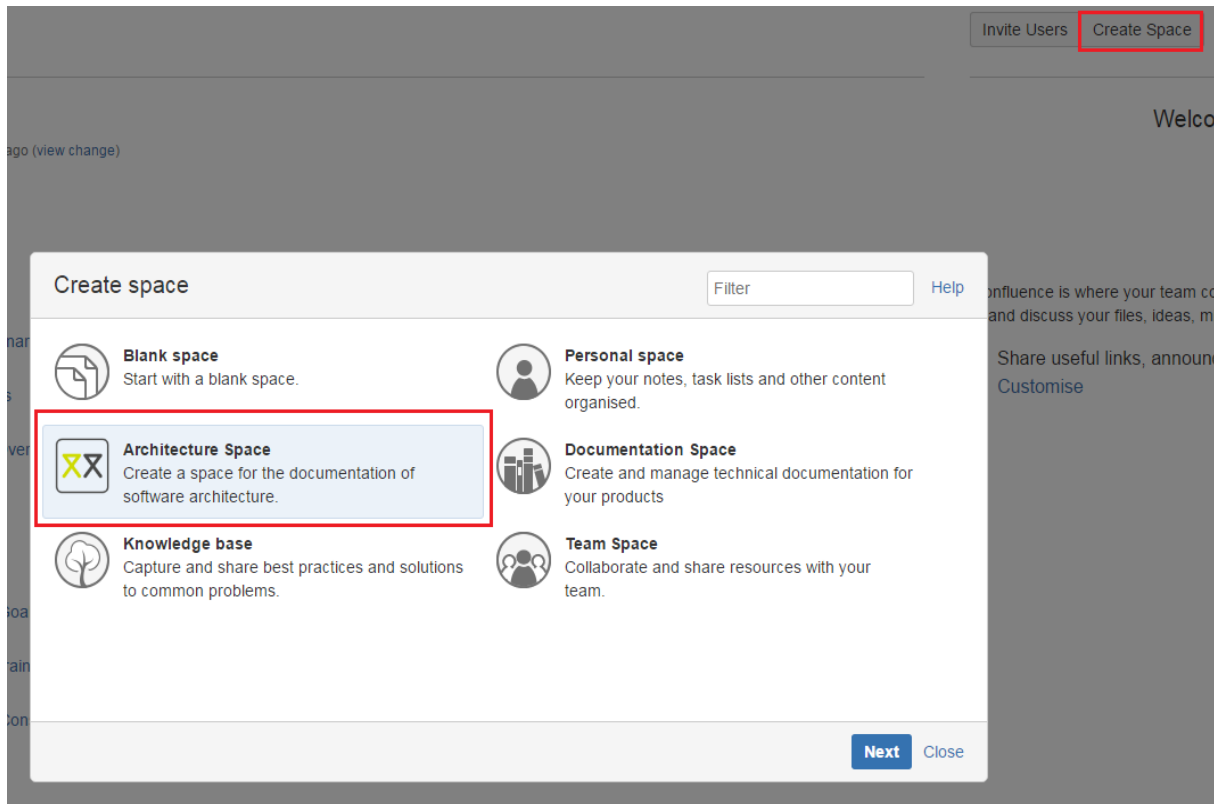

Note:

This version of the template contains some help and explanations. It is used for familiarization with arc42 and the understanding of the concepts.

The easiest way for browsing this space is to turn on the sidebar of confluence. You will find the button for it on the lefthand side at the bottom corner of your browser, portrayed as two arrows. Click on it - and the sidebar will show up.

The sidebar works like any browser tree structure. It shows all the 12 chapters of the ARC42 Template. Click on the arrow to see the subchapters or hide them again.

Content Overview

1. Introduction and Goals

Short description of the requirements, driving forces, extract (or abstract) of requirements. Top three (max five) quality goals for the architecture which have highest priority for the major stakeholders. A table of important stakeholders with their expectation regarding architecture.



2. Architecture Constraints

Anything that constrains teams in design and implementation decisions or decision about related processes. Can sometimes go beyond individual systems and are valid for whole organizations and companies.

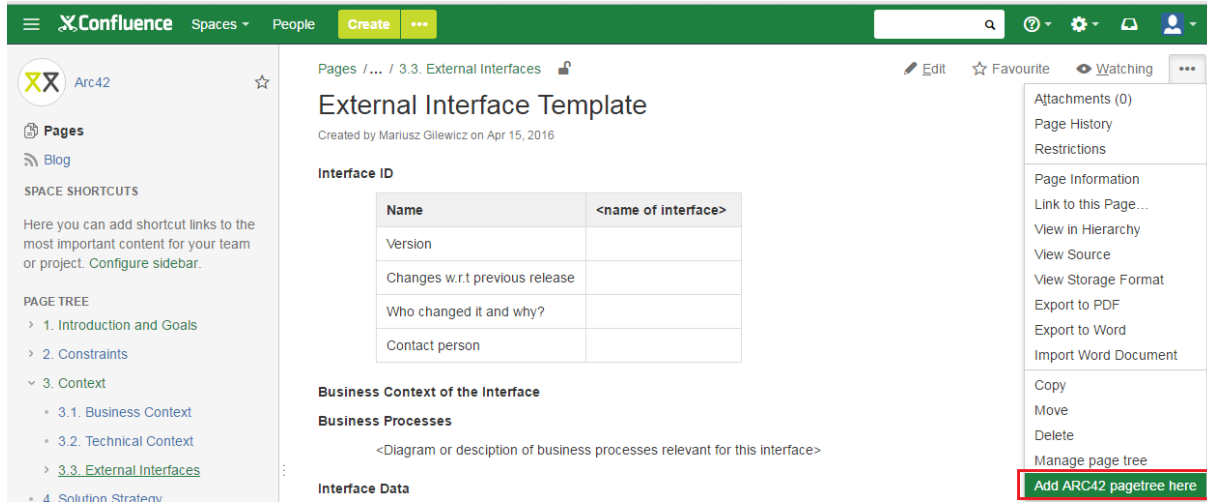
2. Add the arc42 page tree to a location of your choice

The second feature of the plugin is, that an arc42 page tree can not only be added with a whole space but also as only a

pagetree at a location of your choice.

To do so go to a page inside confluence where you want to add the arc42 pagetree. From this page you can add the page tree either as subpages to the current page or you can overwrite the current page with the home page of the page tree.

Click in the right corner on Tools -> Add arc42 pagetree here.



In the next step you are asked to choose if you want to overwrite the current page or not and if you want to mark the pages with the label "arc42-added", to make it easier to search for arc42 pages in confluence.
